

# HORSE SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The Golburn Fair Horse Show will be conducted under the current rules of the Equine Canada (EC) and is sanctioned by the Saskatchewan Horse Federation (SHF). The show committee reserves the right to make decisions on matters not specified in this prize list.
2. **DATE:** Saturday, August 9th, 2025. Horse show will start at 8:30 am, sharp. Registration booth will be open by 8:00 a.m.
3. **DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES:** Entries and fees paid in full must be received no later than one week before Fair Day. Entry and membership fees are non-refundable.
  - \*An entry form and liability waiver has been included in the centre of the booklet. Please photocopy or attach an additional page if you require more space. We require a separate entry form and waiver for each exhibitor; however, those who are showing more than one horse may enter all their horses on the same form.
  - \* Late and ringside entries will be double the fee with the exception of lead line, spectator western pleasure and our optional surprise class. All ringside entries must fill out an entry form & waiver.
  - \* Ringside entries **will not** be accepted for any of the jackpot classes.
  - \* Unless otherwise stated in the program, the entry fee is \$3.00 per event.
  - \* There is an administration fee of \$5.00 per rider.
  - \* Exhibitors 16 years and older are required to pay the \$3.00 Golburn Agricultural Society membership fee, but membership is open to anyone who would like to support the fair in this way.

5. **GATE ADMISSION:** All exhibitors are required to pay the general admission fees at the gate on fair morning: \$5 for adults, \$2 for children, preschoolers are free. We will be counting on your co-operation in this matter if you arrive the evening before the fair.
6. **MANDATORY HELMET RULE:** Participants 18 years of age and under will not be allowed into the ring for any class unless they are wearing an approved helmet (bicycle helmets do not meet the required standard). Ages are as of January 1st of the current year.
7. **PRIZE PAYOUT:**
  - \* Regular classes - First - \$12; Second - \$10; Third - \$8; Fourth - \$6; Fifth - \$4
  - \* Jackpot classes - any sponsorship obtained for the jackpot events will be added to the entry fee pot, which 90% of the pot will be paid out - 40%, 30%, 20% and 10%.

## 8. SPECIAL SPONSORED PRIZES:

\* Class 1: First and second place exhibitors in each division (except pee wee) of the halter and western pleasure classes are eligible to compete in the championship class for the respective event. There are no entry fees for the championship classes. Grand and reserve championship prizes will be awarded.

\* Class 2: Gymkhana Best Combined Times. The best combined times of each of the age divisions, calculated on a horse & rider combination, will receive a prize. The classes to be used to calculate this award will be Barrel Racing, Pole Bending and Stake Race.

\* Aggregate Hi-Point - The rider and horse combination who receives the most points throughout the entire fair day will be awarded the Aggregate Hi-Point Award. Points are awarded for each class and totalled at the end of fair day.

\* Pot of Gold. One class/age division throughout the day will be chosen at random to be the Pot of Gold class. The winner of this class will receive double the prize payout.

*\* We are fortunate to have several classes that are sponsored by individual and local businesses. Please take the time to thank them for their support.*

## 9. AGE DIVISIONS: (age as of January 1 of the current year)

Senior	18 years and over
Junior A	15 - 17 years
Junior B	12 - 14 years
Junior C	11 years and under
Pee Wee	8 years and under

## 10. HORSE/RIDER/EVENT:

\* Exhibitors will be given a number for each horse, when they register, which must be pinned in clear view on each side of the saddle blanket.

\* Exhibitors may compete in only one age division of an event. With the exception of Pee Wee aged exhibitors, who may enter in either the Pee Wee class or the Junior C division, but not both age divisions of the same event.

\* A horse may be shown or ridden by only one exhibitor in each event. With the exception of Pee Wee exhibitors, who may share a horse with another exhibitor in up to 3 classes.

\* A horse used in one age division of an event cannot be used in another age division, with the exception of lead line, pee wee and spectator western pleasure classes.

\* Exhibitors may enter up to 2 horses in halter classes (1-5), timed gymkhana classes and the jackpot open trail class. Both horses must be saddled.

\* If an improper entry is made regarding the height of a horse or the age of an exhibitor, they will be entered in the proper section, unless that section has been previously judged.

11. **PROGRAM ORDER:**

\* Our Show begins at 8:30 am in the order listed under Class 1. The show committee reserves the right to cancel, combine or split divisions of events based on the number of entries. Any changes to the Class 1 schedule will be posted by 7:30 the morning of the show and by noon for Class 2. The show committee reserves the right to cancel, combine or split divisions of events based on the number of entries.

\* Gymkhana will follow the completion of Class 1 events and may not run in the exact order as listed under Class 2. \* **ONE-MINUTE WARNING FOR ALL CLASSES** - Please be ready to enter the ring when the class or your number is called. The ring gate will be closed one minute after the final call.

12. **PROTESTS & DISPUTES:** These will be reviewed by a committee of two horse show directors and an executive member of the Golburn Agricultural Society. Please submit your protest in writing along with a \$50 deposit to the sound booth. The deposit will be refunded if the committee rules in your favour.

13. **MISCONDUCT/ABUSE:** Exhibitors will be disqualified or requested to leave the grounds for abusing their horses in any manner, or for misconduct on the part of either the exhibitor or horse in the ring or anywhere on the fairgrounds. The judge's decision is final regarding situations in the ring, while the show committee will rule on incidents that arise elsewhere.

14. **SAFETY:**

\* **All participants 18 years and younger, as of January 1 of the current year must wear an ASTM/SEI approved riding helmet.**

\* Horses must be confined to the ring, stall and trailer areas and cannot be led or ridden to other parts of the fairgrounds or parking lot.

\* Make way for exhibitors entering and exiting the ring. Parents and adults must ensure that children, whether they are spectators or exhibitors, stay clear of the ride-out area at all times.

\* For minor incidents, a first aid kit is available at the sound booth.

\* Please report all accidents that occur on the grounds during fair day to the sound booth so that the required documentation can be filed with the SHF.

15. **FACILITIES:**

\* If you will be tying to your trailer in the parking lot, please pick up all manure. There will be a wheelbarrow at the gate if you need one. We have to make sure that there is no manure left in the parking lot.

PLEASE KEEP YOUR HORSE AWAY FROM THE BINS AND OUT OF THE CROPS. Thank you very much for your co-operation in this matter.

\* Camping in the parking lot is permitted, so please set up in an orderly manner if you don't want to have to move on fair morning! Parking is usually very tight on fair day. *Horse trailers must be parked facing east & west in rows from north to south.*

\* There is no running water or power for campers. Water for the horses will be available in the horse area and drinking water will be in the tank at the east side of the concession. The concession booth will open with a pancake breakfast at 7 a.m. the morning of the fair. Hot dogs, burgers, cold plates, homemade pies, treats, cold drinks and coffee will be sold on fair day.

10. GRAND AND RESERVE CHAMPION HALTER HORSE - 1st and 2nd place winners from sections 6-9 are eligible
11. WESTERN PLEASURE - Senior
12. WESTERN PLEASURE - Junior A
13. WESTERN PLEASURE - Junior B
14. WESTERN PLEASURE - Junior C
15. GRAND AND RESERVE CHAMPION WESTERN PLEASURE HORSE - 1st and 2nd place winners from sections 12-15 are eligible.
16. WESTERN PLEASURE: Pee Wee - A walk/trot class for riders 8 years of age and under who have not competed in the Junior C western pleasure class.
17. WESTERN PLEASURE - WALK/TROT - open to any age of individual not entered in any other western pleasure class
18. LEAD LINE - For riders 6 years and under who have not shown in the Pee Wee division. There is no entry fee for this class and entries will be taken on fair day. Instead of prize money, the riders will receive special ribbons and small prizes.

19. SPECTATORS' WESTERN PLEASURE - For people of all ages who have not entered in any of the above western pleasure classes. If you think you're up for the challenge, borrow a horse and give it a try! Must wear proper boots and headgear as stipulated under the helmet rule.
20. HORSEMANSHIP - Senior
21. HORSEMANSHIP - Junior A
22. HORSEMANSHIP - Junior B
23. HORSEMANSHIP - Junior C
24. GRAND AND RESERVE CHAMPION HORSEMANSHIP. 1st and 2nd place winners from sections 20-23 are eligible.
25. HORSEMANSHIP - Pee Wee - A walk/trot class for riders 8 years of age and under who have not competed in the Junior C horsemanship class.
26. COMMAND CLASS - 11 years and under
27. COMMAND CLASS - OPEN
28. 4-H EVENTS - No entry fee. Please include club name on entry form.  
A) CLUB RIDE
29. SADDLE PAIRS – one person per pair needs to register.
30. TRAIL CLASS – 11 years and under, walk, trot only.
31. TRAIL CLASS – OPEN.
32. COSTUME - Open to all ages and all costumes/themes. Depending upon the entries received, this class may be divided into two sections according to age or costume (fancy or comic).
33. GIVE IT A TRY – ENGLISH RIDING - Open Jackpot - Try something new. Entry fee of \$15. This jackpot is geared for beginners and non-experienced riders of this riding style. Class may be split depending on the experience of those entered and some saddles are available to use on fair if requested on entry form.

## CLASS 2 - GYMKHANA

**Start time to follow the completion of Class 1, but will not begin before 3 p.m.**

Exhibitors may enter up to 2 horses in barrels, poles, stakes and the jackpot classes.

44. RUN AND RIDE - One way only for participants 11 years and under (runner and rider). A horse may be used only one time, but participants are allowed to ride once and run once. Runners must be of the same age division.
45. RUN AND RIDE - For teams 12 years and over. Two-way circuit with runner and rider switching at midpoint without breaking the time barrier, then returning home. A horse may not be used twice. Runners must be of the same age division.
46. RING RACE - Open Jackpot - entry fee of \$15. Prize payout as stated in the regulations. First place winner also receives an added price.
47. KEYHOLE RACE - Senior
48. KEYHOLE RACE - Junior A
49. KEYHOLE RACE - Junior B
50. KEYHOLE RACE - Junior C
51. KEYHOLE RACE - Pee Wee
52. BOOT RACE - 11 years and under. Ride down and lead back.
53. BOOT RACE - 12 years and over. Ride down and run back.
54. MUSICAL TIRES - 11 years and under. Walk/trot only. Riders will not need to dismount but be standing beside their tires. Class may be split according to age if required.
55. MUSICAL TIRES - 12 years and over. This class may be split, according to age, if there are more than 12 riders entered.
54. SURPRISE CLASS - Weather and time permitting, extra gymkhana events may be scheduled for the end of the day. Events will be announced on fair day and ringside entries will be accepted.
